
## The NRSN Uganda Community of Practice Survey results

2. The added value in joining the CoP is to get key information on funding resources for project proposals followed by gaining quicker access to expertise and the ability to ask questions to experts and peers


#### Value added of joining the CoP (> 30%)

3. The majority of respondents would be willing to contribute to the CoP by **hosting/participating in relevant meetings** 




