In early 2021, the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD), a specialized agency of the United Nations, through its Financing Facility for Remittances (FFR), established the **Uganda National Remittance Stakeholder Network (NRSN)** within the Platform for Remittances, Investments and Migrants' Entrepreneurship in Africa (PRIME Africa).

Aim of the network is to **gather key stakeholders in the Uganda remittance industry** to facilitate dialogue among parties, share information, challenges, opportunities and practices.

The **NRSN Uganda Community of Practice (CoP)** comes to address the members' needs for more continuous, specific and in-depth discussion on remittances and its applications. Specifically, it offers an inclusive and collaborative space for its members to exchange practices that promote innovative business models and products, showcase public-private-partnerships and address new trends and market opportunities.

In particular, objectives of the CoP are to:

- connect remittance stakeholders across sectors to facilitate dialogue, exchange knowledge, develop joint initiatives and identify solutions
- allow access to a shared repository
- update members on data, markets and regulations
- enhance company visibility

- remittance regulatory compliance practices

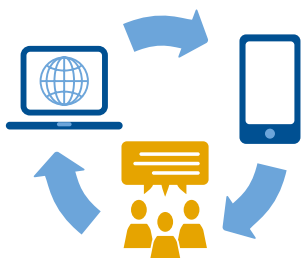
COP MEMBERSHIP
