# SOUTH AFRICA National Remittance Stakeholder Network



## Community of Practice

The National Remittance Stakeholder Network (NRSN) South Africa was established as part of the PRIME Africa initiative, implemented by IFAD through the Financing Facility for Remittances (FFR). To build a dedicated NRSN Community of Practice (CoP) aimed at promoting discussions and further interactions, and to better identify needs and preferences, key South African stakeholders contributed to the present survey, the results of which are presented hereafter.


#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- Remittance-linked financial services is the most sought-after topic for conducting business
- Respondents suggested that the CoP should convene the industry to share learnings and facilitate interaction/communication with other stakeholders to support the community in engaging more effectively
- The added value in joining the CoP is gaining quicker access to expertise and the ability to ask questions to experts and peers
- Up-to-date and useful information and knowledge resources are the most relevant features the CoP should have

- Periodic workshop and/or meetings on specific topics is the most relevant feature the CoP should have
- LinkedIn is the preferred platform to deepen the knowledge on the South African remittance market
- The majority of respondents would like to be engaged on a monthly basis or bimonthly basis
- The hybrid modality of rolling out the CoP is the preferred option
- The majority of respondents would be willing to contribute to the CoP by hosting/participating in relevant meetings


#### Type of organization/institution

#### Remittance-related topics that most interest the business activity (≥ 30%)

Digital channels	50%
Regulation and compliance	46%
Data and Market Insights	41%
Corridor Specificities	41%
Diaspora engagement	36%
Remittance-linked financial services	32%

#### Additional remittance-related topics/areas of interest (≥ 30%)


Remittance regulatory compliance practices	64%
Drivers for remittance cost reduction	50%
AML/CFT fraud issues affecting both cash-based and digital transactions	36%
Vulnerable and underserved groups (e.g. rural population, women, youth, refugees and forcibly displaced persons)	31%

## VALUE ADDED AND FEATURES OF THE COP TO GENERATE INTEREST

#### Value added of joining the CoP (≥ 30%)

Quicker access to expertise and the ability to ask questions to experts and peers	68%
Workshops on specific topics	50%
Key information on funding resources for project proposals (donors, open call for proposals, etc.)	46%
Access to a roster of remittance experts/consultants	32%
Access to case studies	32%

#### Features of the CoP to generate interest (≥ 30%)


Periodic workshops and/or meetings on specific topics	73%
Up-to-date and useful information and knowledge resources	68%
Availability of knowledge products (e.g. videos, training material, success stories, lessons learned, etc.)	64%
Discussions on specific topics of shared interest	64%

## PREFERRED PLATFORM, FREQUENCY AND MODALITY TO IMPLEMENT THE COP

- 81% of respondents deepen their knowledge of the South African remittance market through online searches
- 90% of respondents preferred using LinkedIn, followed by Twitter (30%)
- 68% of respondents would like to engage on monthly or bimonthly basis, while 27% once every three months
- 82% of respondents prefer hybrid modality of rolling out the CoP
