
Registration

Registration is the recording, verifying and updating of information on individual persons of concern to UNHCR for

- Protection
- Assistance
- Implementing durable solutions.



PRIMES tools





Reception, Registration, Documentation Processes

- Influx registration occurs immediately after reception with HH level documents issued
- Movement/entry in small numbers delays in registration and movement of persons to settlements due to logistics involved. Registration may occur immediately after reception. Documents are issued after movement of persons to the settlement.
- Continuous Registration data updates, family composition, verification and IPE



Urban Context

- Delay between reception and registration due to several factors. Current delay from backlog carried forward from 2022, continuing to affect arrivals in 2023.
- All persons registered with Asylum Seeker status and issued Asylum Seeker Certificates (3 months expiry)
- Refugee Status Determination processes
- Refugee Family Attestation + ID Card issued



Document Types

All refugees receive:

- The refugee family attestation with a validity of three years issued on secure paper (A4 format).
- The refugee ID card: issued to all refugees aged 16 years and above.

All Asylum seekers receive:

Asylum seeker certificates with validity of three months issued on secure paper (A4 format)




Security Features


Front:

- 1D barcode for the individual
- Microtext (on the far right and left)
- Automatically generated serial number with a QR code
- Watermark of OPM logo

Back:

 Verifiable QR code containing Individual ID, Name of individual, Date of Birth, Sex, Country of Origin, Group Number, Relationship to Focal Point, issued date, expiry date and photo.




