Background

- On 19th September 2016 UN High Level Meeting on Refugees & Migrants → Heads of States came together within the UN General Assembly to discuss issues related to migration and refugees.
- The meeting culminated with the adoption of the New York Declaration for Refugees & Migrants in which Members States:
 - Commitment to launch a process to develop a Global Compact on Refugees;
 - Commitment to launch a process to develop a Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration; The process culminated with the adoption of the GCM in an intergovernmental conference in Morroco in December 2018.

Why is the GCM important?

- The first intergovermentally negotiated and adopted agreement to address all dimensions of international migration
- Supports international cooperation on the governance of international migration
- A set of mutually reinforcing commitments for **achieving a shared vision** of safe, orderly and regular migration
- Same vison as expressed by SDG target 10.7
- Nonbinding framework that gives states flexibility to implement based on their own migration realities and capacities
- The GCM highlights the importance of multi-stakeholder approaches, including engagement with the private, as part of more comprehensive solutions to migration and development.

Promote faster, safer and cheaper transfer of remittances and foster financial inclusion of migrants

- Harmonize remittance market regulations and increase remittance infrastructure
- Reduce the transaction costs of migrant remittances to less than 3 per cent
- Develop innovative technological solutions for remittance transfer;
- Establish conducive frameworks for competitive and innovative remittance market;
- Develop programmes and instruments to promote investments from remittance senders
- Enable migrant women to access financial literacy training and formal remittance transfer systems;
- Provide access to and develop banking solutions and financial instruments for migrants;
- Promote and support UN Remittances Day and IFAD's Global Forum on on Remittances, Investment and Development
