- Uganda exports over 80,000 Migrant Workers every year,
- Currently has over 500,000 Ugandan workers in Saudi Arabia & UAE
- Over 300, 000 of these migrant workers from Uganda are <u>young women aged 25 to 35 years</u> and 60% are single mums.
- Regionally, Kenya and Tanzania export similar numbers per year, and My Guardian works globally.



6. WHAT SERVICES DO MIGRANT WORKERS CRITICALLY NEED?

- Remittances: Safe, Fast and Economical way to send money home
- Communication: Stay connected to people at home effectively and economically.
- Financial Services: Migrant Workers need bank accounts, salary loans, financial advise
- Consular Services: They need Work Visas / Permits, Legal assistance, passport renewals
- Healthcare: They require adequate medical services and Safety abroad



WHAT'S NEXT?

- Remittances: We are seeking a partner to introduce to the MWs as an affordable Remittance Partner
- Financial Services: We are seeking highly considerate lending institutions to consider loan facilities of about \$2,000 over 24 months for MWs
